You may link to rebeccabaer.com if you wish to share the information contained in this document.</p> <p>Due to the intricate detail, the stencils are delicate and must be cleaned carefully. Lay the stencil flat on a tray and squirt with waterless hand cleaner (also called hand sanitizer or antibacterial hand gel). Gently rub the cleaner over the stencil with your fingertips to remove paint. Facilitate removal of the gel by using liquid soap and water. Rinse the stencil well and lay it flat on a towel to dry. Stencils may be used several times before cleaning and, when using bottled acrylics, may be cleaned at your convenience using gel as described above. Note: Stencil openings will begin to narrow due to paint build up as a result of repeated use without cleaning. If there is significant paint build up you may wish to soak the stencil in gel to soften the paint and aid removal. Place the stencil on a flat tray, squirt generously with gel and cover with plastic wrap to prevent evaporation. When the paint has sufficiently softened, continue as described above.</p>	Clean at your convenience
Deco Art Decorating Paste	Antibacterial Hand Gel or Industrial Fast Orange waterless hand cleaner	<p>Always clean the stencil immediately after use for embossing. Dried paste may ruin the stencil. Due to the intricate detail of the stencil it is delicate and must be cleaned carefully. Lay the stencil flat on a tray and squirt with gel or cleaner. Gently rub over the stencil with your fingertips to remove the paste. As long as the stencil remains on the wet, flat surface you may use a brush to gently clean the openings. The wet surface will cause the stencil to hold fast to the flat tray and avoid damage caused by lifting. Rinse the stencil well and place it flat on a towel to dry. For repeated use it is necessary to clean the stencil after two to three applications of decorating paste as the stencil openings will begin to narrow due to paste build up.</p>	Clean stencils immediately
RB Clearly Elegant™ Stenciling Gel	Warm Water	<p>Due to the intricate detail of the stencil it is delicate and must be cleaned carefully. Lay the stencil flat on a tray and rinse with warm water. Gently rub over the stencil with your fingertips to remove the gel. Rinse the stencil well and place it flat on a towel to dry.</p>	Immediately
RB Gilded Leafing Adhesive	91% Isopropyl (rubbing) Alcohol	<p>Immediately clean the stencil and brush with 91% isopropyl alcohol. Due to the intricate detail of the stencil it is delicate and must be cleaned carefully. Place the stencil flat on a tray and gently rub over the stencil with your fingertips to remove the adhesive. Facilitate dispersal of the alcohol with Liquid soap, rinse well and place the stencil flat on a towel to dry. When working with leafing adhesive, begin with a clean stencil and clean the stencil immediately following use.</p>	Clean immediately
